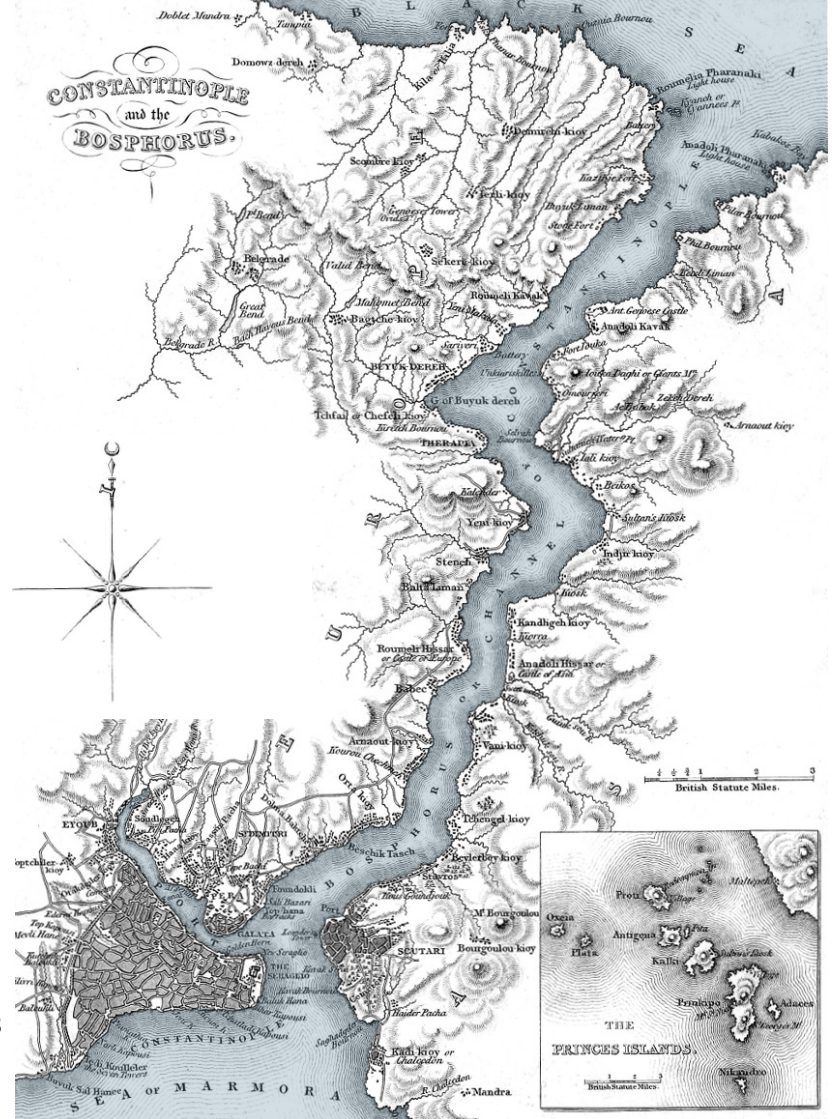


# Sustainable cities and communities - SC2

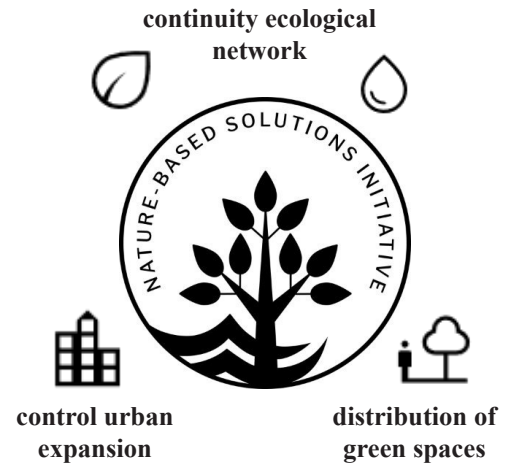

## Context

The health crisis resulting from the covid-19 pandemic has overlapped with the environmental crisis accumulated since the beginning of developmentalism and the economic growth of recent decades. The horizon of new normality should entail recovery from both crises, ensuring strong sustainability: environmental, social and economic. Such a recovery should be based on a new “carbon-free” model to combat the climate crisis, and on a paradigm shift that fosters the transition towards cities and communities that are fairer to their physical and human environment: post-growth. Specifically, the proposed programme as a whole will be framed within goal 11 of the UN Sustainable Development Goals 2030: “Sustainable cities and communities”.





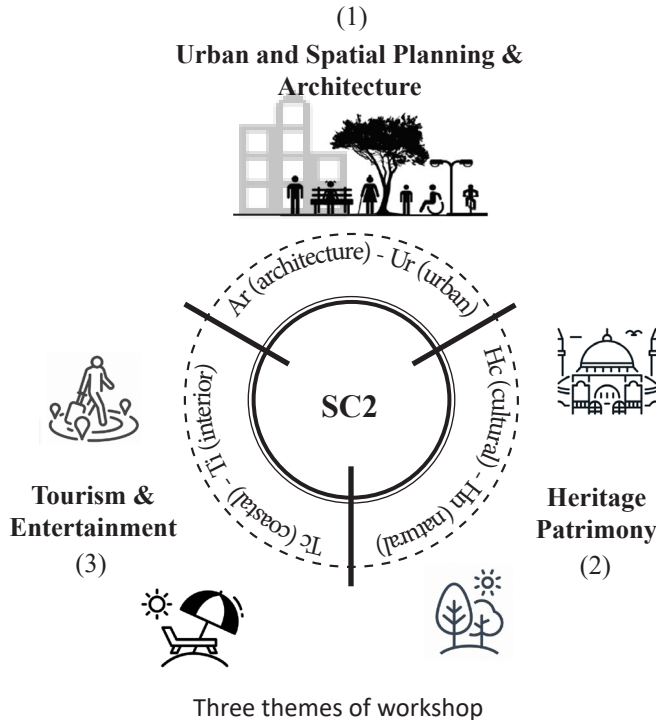
# Objectives

— The general objective of the proposal is to recover from the covid-19 health crisis associated with decarbonisation in environmental, social and economic aspects in the fight against the climate crisis.

— The set of work will be framed within objective 11 -Sustainable cities and communities-, of the UN's 2030 Sustainable Development Goals. In particular, it will focus on the post-growth paradigm and strong sustainability.

— The proposal is organized through a multidisciplinary approach. For this, it has the three disciplines of urbanism and architecture, heritage and tourism, to develop joint work.

— İstanbul, Safranbolu and Amasra, the places of study, were chosen as the laboratory, due to their fundamental differences in location, urban development, size and history, and for the possibility of being able to confront the disciplines that are the object of the workshop, and develop an analysis, reflection and collective and transversal results.





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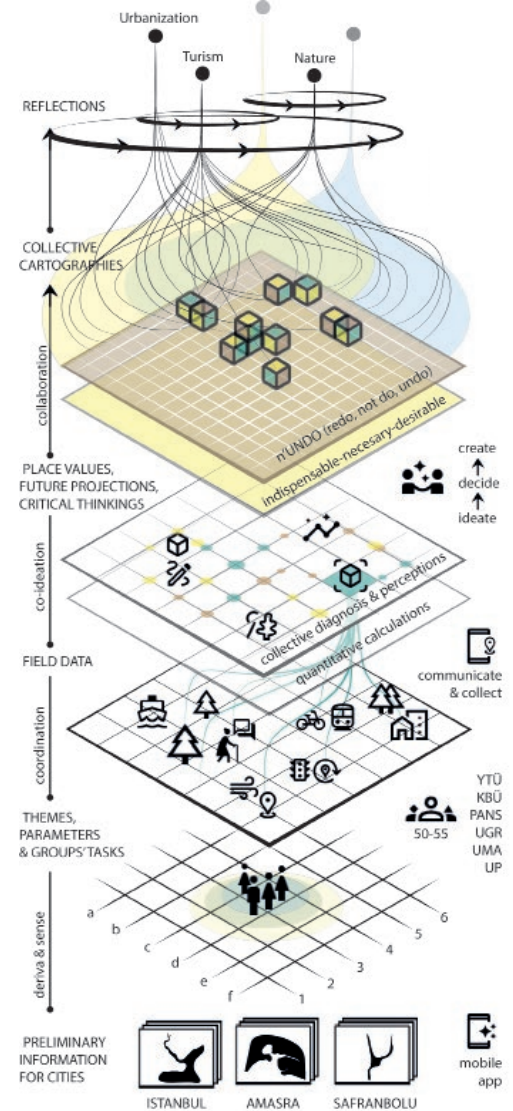

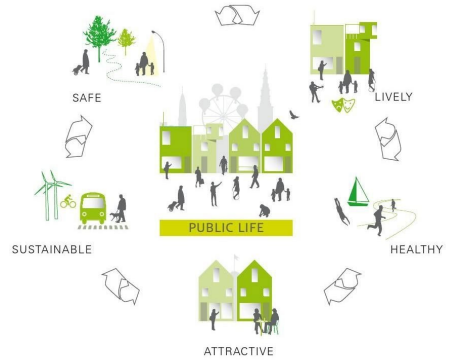

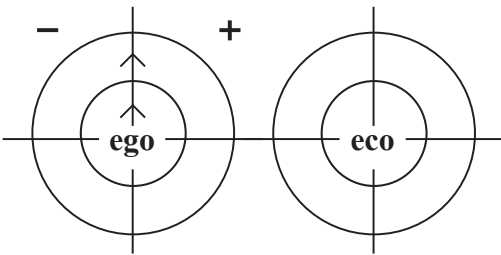

## 4. Collective Cartography

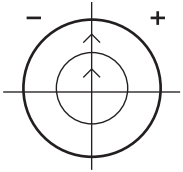
According to the field detections and discussions, co-creations will be brought together for all three working areas as collective cartography. Here, ideas created with different techniques will be used to question the experience in the field.

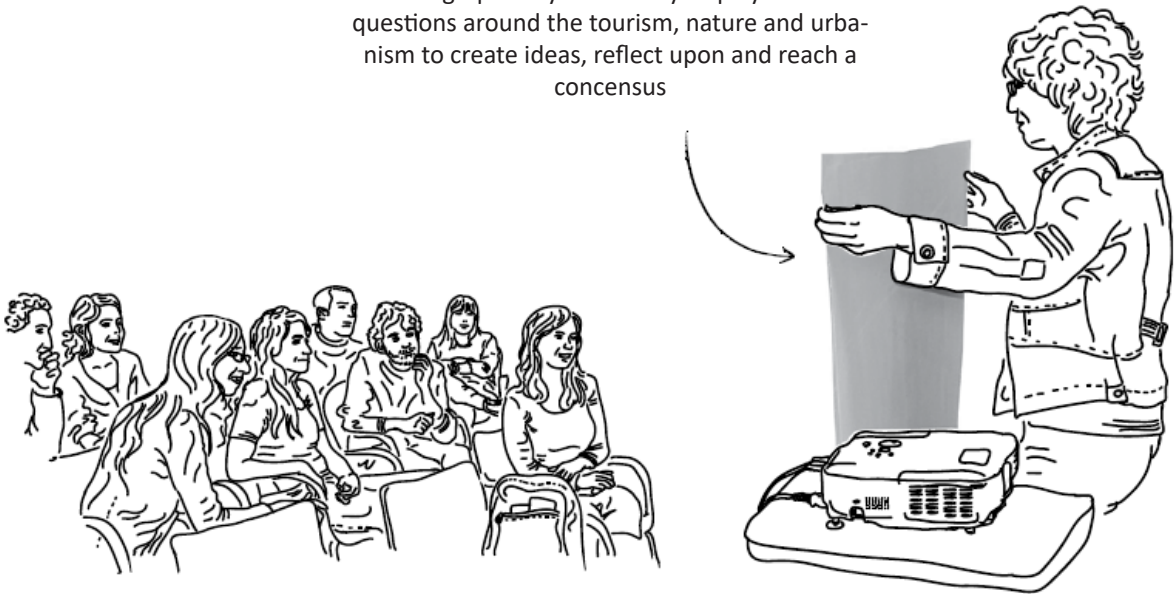

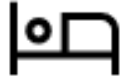
take the metro **M11** (Istanbul Havalimanı-Gayrettepe line)
